Gastonia's Citizens Police Academy Accepting Applications

Applications are being accepted for the spring semester of Gastonia Police Department's Citizens Police Academy, which is scheduled to begin in mid-March. The Citizens Police Academy focuses on Gastonia Police operations. Law enforcement is a profession that is continually changing and evolving, and the academy enables citizens to experience conditions similar to those that police officers go through in their training and on the job.

Participants meet from 6 p.m.-8:30 p.m. one night a week for 11 weeks. Training topics will include segments on the department's K-9 unit, SWAT Team, the Identification Bureau (crime scene investigations), Patrol Officer techniques, Crime Prevention programs and many other components of the police department. In addition, participants are expected to ride along with a police officer for at least two hours during the program.

Academy participants must be at least 18 years of age or older, and be subject to a background check. There is no fee for the academy – just a commitment to attend all the classes. Space is limited to 20 participants.
